First Presbyterian Church is a reformed, confessional, ordinary means of grace congregation that exists to exalt God, edify and equip the saints, evangelize the lost, and extend the love, mercy, and mission of Christ locally and around the world.

REFORMED: We find our roots in the 16th century Protestant Reformation and affirm the five solas of the Reformation: Sola Scriptura (Scripture Alone), Sola Fide (Faith Alone), Solus Christus (Christ Alone), Sola Gratia (Grace Alone) and Soli Deo Gloria (To the Glory of God Alone).

CONFESSIONAL: As a member church of the Presbyterian Church of America (PCA), we embrace and confess that the doctrine found in the Westminster Confession of Faith and the Shorter and Larger Catechism is the most faithful summary of scriptural teaching. The PCA's slogan encapsulates well our beliefs: "Faithful to the Scriptures, True to the Reformed Faith, Obedient to the Great Commission of Jesus Christ."

ORDINARY MEANS OF GRACE: We believe God builds His Church and promises to bless Her through His ordinary means of grace, which are: the Word (especially preaching), Sacraments (biblically regulated worship), and Prayer.

First Presbyterian Church is committed to the primacy of corporate worship. Regular attendance to the ordinary means of grace is vital for believers' spiritual nourishment and growth in the grace and knowledge of Jesus Christ. God's people are therefore called to participate regularly in the Lord's Day corporate worship, in dependence upon God's Spirit who applies Christ's benefits through His Word, prayer, and the sacraments. As such, we encourage you and your family to consider the various ministries, fellowship events, and educational opportunities, such as weekly Bible studies and Sunday school classes, as complementary to corporate worship, but never as replacement of corporate worship.

The Sermon *CHRIST IN ISAIAH: THE KING, THE LORD OF HOSTS*

Today's Service

Today Pastor Drew continues in his new mini-series called "Christ in Isaiah." There are several allusions to Christ in the prophecies of Isaiah, all amazingly accurate, and all written hundreds of years before His birth. Isaiah's remarkable prophecies about Christ's suffering and death put the case for supernatural prophecy beyond reasonable doubt, confounding the modern critics who deny it.

With this in mind, Pastor Drew is preaching a sermon today called *Christ in Isaiah: the King, the LORD of Hosts* based on Isaiah 6:1-7. Isaiah describes his vision of the Lord upon His throne in this passage, and John explains in his gospel that Isaiah saw Christ's glory, proving that Jesus our Savior is God (John 12:41).

All of our vanity, ambition, ignorance and pride should vanish in this view of Christ in holiness and glory. This vision overwhelmed Isaiah with a full sense of his own sin and depravity. As Isaiah wrote, it should also convince us that all of our righteousness is nothing but filthy rags. Thanks be to God we have a Savior whose ministry allows us to dare to commune with the all Holy God because of His glorious mercy and grace in Jesus Christ.

The apostle Paul tells us that this glorious Christ *"though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross"* (Phil. 2:5-8).

Christ's humiliation means that people ignore, mock and even denigrate Him. This will come to an end, however, and Paul continues and writes, *"Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father"* (Phil. 2:9-11).

We close our service then with Edward Perronet's famous hymn, *All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name*. This hymn has often been called the "National Anthem of Christendom." Please join us then as we, with joyous anticipation, await that time in heaven when "every kindred and every tribe" will sing to Christ our Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

"All hail the power of Jesus' name! Let angels prostrate fall; bring forth the royal diadem, and crown Him Lord of all!"
