Today's Service

Today Dr. William Edgar, American apologist and professor at Westminster Seminary concludes our 2015 Engaging Unbelief Conference with a sermon based on Luke 4:1-15 titled, *We Shall Overcome*. The conference (held from January 23-25, 2015) addressed the often-debated issues of the problem of evil. The existence of evil in the world raises questions from atheists such as these: If God is both good and all-powerful, why does evil exist? Atheists then conclude that either God is not good, or God is not all-powerful, and therefore is not worthy of worship.

In Luke 4:1-15 Jesus confronts Satan in the wilderness, which is also recorded in Matthew 4:1-11. Jesus fasted for forty days, corresponding to the forty years of wandering Israel went through in the Old Testament. Unlike Israel, which failed its test of obedience, Jesus was fully obedient, and triumphed over Satan by relying on God's Word. For every temptation of Satan, Jesus responded by quoting Scripture, which is a reminder to all believers that the Word of God – the Bible is our strongest apologetic tool in engaging and confronting unbelief in our world.

We close our service with Martin Luther's powerful hymn, *A Mighty Fortress Is Our God.* Though the exact date of its composition is unknown, most hymnologists believe it was written for the Diet of Spires in 1529, when the term *protestant* was first used. It became the great rallying cry of the Reformation ever since. As we consider how we can stand against the rampant unbelief we face in our world today we should remember these verses of Psalm 46, upon which Luther's hymn is based: "Be still, and know that I am God. I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth!" The LORD of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our fortress" (Psalm 46:10, 11). Won't you join us as we sing with full confidence in our great God and in His Word?

"That Word above all earthly powers, no thanks to them, abideth; the Spirit and the gifts are ours through Him who with us sideth. Let goods and kindred go, this mortal life also; the body they may kill: God's truth abideth still; His kingdom is forever."



Dr. William Edgar. William "Bill" Edgar is an American apologist and professor at Westminster Theological Seminary. He has been called by Charles Colson, "One of evangelicalism's most valued scholars and apologists". He is the author of several books including A Transforming Vision: The Lord's Prayer as a Lens for Life, Reasons of the Heart: Recovering Christian Persuasion, Schaeffer on the Christian Life and co-author of Christian Apologetics Past and Present (Vol. 1 and Vol. 2).
